◇ Lectures

- General lectures such as **Introduction to Modern Korean History** will be delivered for all participants while other lectures will be taught in six different classes from Class 1 through 6.

◇ Korean Language Classes

- The classes will be offered by trainees' Korean capabilities, so please inform the staff of your Korean level at the registration desk.

◇ Lesson Plan & Group Discussion

- All trainees will be divided into 10 groups of 4~6 participants to make lesson plans based on all four lectures on the 14th and to work together on presenting the lesson plan on the 15th.
- This session will be done with the assistance and instructions by the designated instructors for each class.

◇ Lesson Presentation & Evaluation (12/15)

- Each group will deliver a 15~20 minute lesson presentation.
- After a few lesson presentations are done, trainees will evaluate their peers, share the results and also get the instructor's feedback.

◇ Korean History Experience

- Since this is a field trip based lecture, please make sure to be board on time on every departure for smooth time arrangement. Your cooperation on this will be a vital factor of this Training and is highly appreciated.

◇ Novel Influenza A(H1A1) Health Alert & Self-monitoring System

- Purpose : to prevent anyone from being infected with the H1A1 flu, a global epidemic which is highly contagious and spreads quickly, by medical checkups and self-monitoring
- Process
 - Filling out a sheet regarding Novel Influenza A(H1A1) given by EPIK
 - Measuring your body temperature by EPIK medical staff at your arrival
 - Reexamining for further diagnosis if needed
 - Checking your own body temperature everyday
 - Recording the temperature on 'Self-Monitoring Chart')

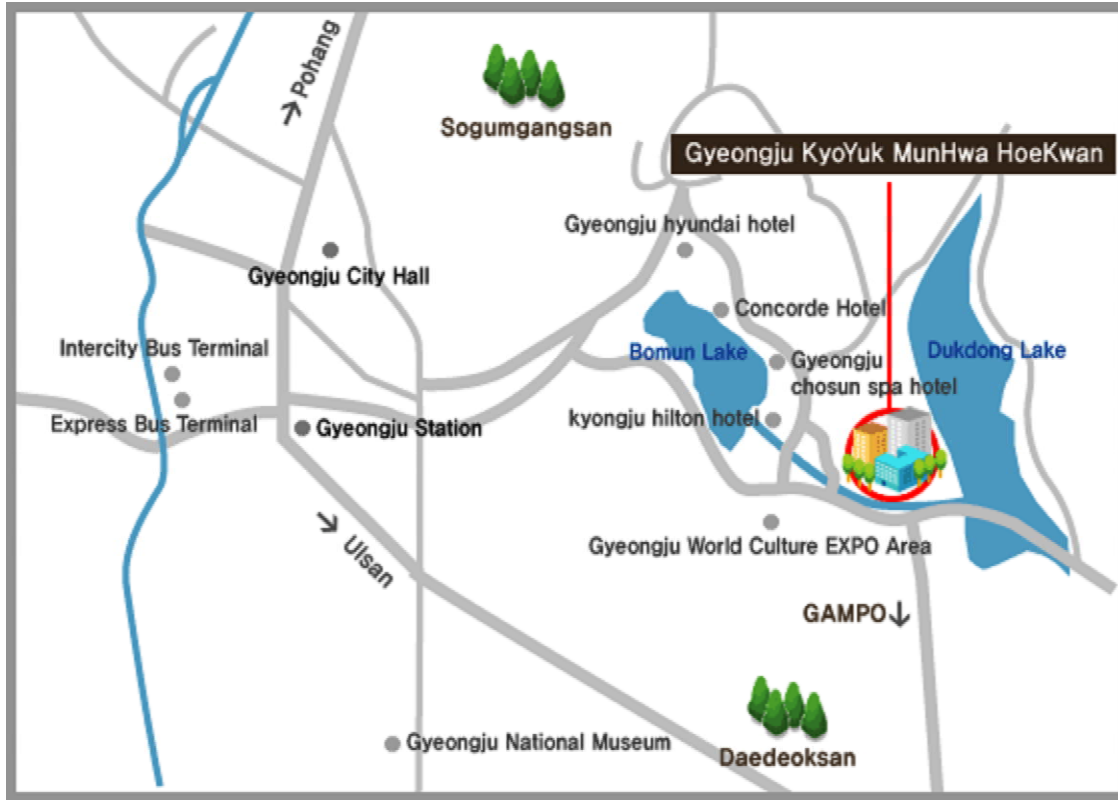

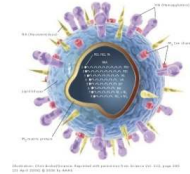

<Appendix – 2> Protect Yourself : Influenza A1

Please read the following information regarding ‘INFLUENZA A1 VIRUS or H1N1 FLU’ and please check your health more carefully during the Workshop.



■■■ Influenza A1

H1N1 flu has become the first 21st century flu pandemic. WHO Director-General Dr. Margaret Chan was quoted as saying “With today’s announcement, WHO moves from an emergency to a longer term response. Based on past experience, this pandemic will be with us for some months, if not years, to come.”

Now that the H1N1 flu has become an official global epidemic and claimed many lives, many people are likely to become anxious that they might catch the H1N1 flu otherwise known as the Swine Flu.

1. The recent A (H1N1) virus is highly contagious and spreads quickly from person to person.
2. Symptoms (very similar to that of seasonal flu) are; fever, runny nose, cough, and or sore throat.
3. If you are experiencing any of the symptoms along with fever.
 - a. Before or at your arrival in the hotel
 - Contact your health care provider
 - You **MUST** report symptoms to EPIK Staff as soon as possible.
 - b. During the Workshop
 - You will be examined and treated by professional medical staff from the EPIK team.
4. At the registration desk in the hotel, our medical staff will check your body temperature.
 - For further and regular self-monitoring, you will be asked to check your body temperature and write it down on the table below, everyday during the Workshop.

■■■ Self-Monitoring

If you are experiencing any of the symptoms along with fever, then please wear the medical mask given at the registration desk and inform the medical staff at room **HyangBiPa B** or contact any EPIK Staff immediately.

Symptoms (very similar to that of seasonal flu) are fever (a temperature ≥ 38 °C), runny nose, cough, and/or sore throat.

- Three Key Steps to Prevent Getting the H1N1 Flu
 - Cover Your Cough
 - Don't Touch Your Face
 - Stay Away from People Who are Sick
